I am trying out Block Study In the MQG Resource Library at this <u>link</u>. My plan is to make a sampler of different blocks by the end of year.

Block studies are a way to learn new techniques and practice them while making beautiful quilts, table runners or wall hangings. If you are looking to practice curves, or try a modern take on a half square triangle, there is a block for that!

The first block is the Punch Block with the drunkard path quarter circle. This is the one I am making. There are templates to download and print, clear instructions and different layouts and colorways to make a whole quilt with this block. I hope to see you all at the next meetings to share our experiences! If you get started early, bring your blocks to the meeting and post them on BNMQG Facebook in Albums, Block Studies. (On a computer you may have to click Media, then Albums.)


I always look forward to receiving my quarterly issue of **Quilting Arts** magazine and the current issue is particularly inspiring to both the art quilter and modern quilter. Subscribing since 2002, I have watched the primary focus of the magazine shift from art quilts and surface design to inclusion of the modern quilt movement and aesthetic. Under the editorial leadership of Vivika Hansen DeNegre the content has evolved to embrace everything modern and still honor the magazine's roots.

The <u>Fall 2023 issue</u> does not disappoint. Get your copy and fall in love with the gallery photos of "Line" from Cloth in Common. This group of international fiber artists accept a challenge every two months and produce amazing work. "Line" challenge covers 14 pages and is eye-catching and inspiring.

Additional pages are dedicated to Quilt National 2023, ice dyeing for beginners, exercises in composition and the importance of value, announcement of the next QA small works Reader's Challenge, and results of the past challenge winners for Art is a Bridge.

I fell in love with this issue's Artist Profile, Beverly Y Smith, and her story is worth a read. I can honestly say that this issue is worth a cup of tea and an afternoon of study.
